

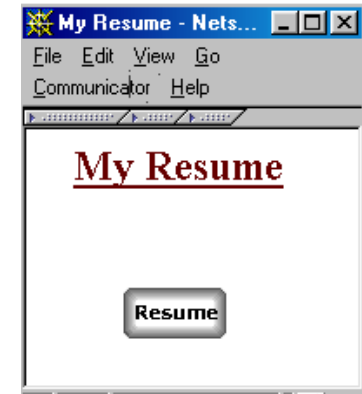
## HTML: Anchor Tag

- Anchor tags are used to create hyperlinks
- Link From Document Text (same folder)  
`<A HREF="resume.html">My Resume</A>`
- Link From Document Image (different folder – use relative path)  
`<A HREF="../Resume/resume.html">  
<IMG SRC="Resume.gif" ALT="Resume"  
BORDER="4"></A>`
- Link to URL  
`<A HREF="http://www.textpad.com/">TextPad</A>`

## HTML: Email Anchor Tag

- It is easy to include a link for email.  
Email: `<A HREF="mailto:boblaurie@yahoo.com">  
boblaurie@yahoo.com </A>`
- Can also be used for an image:  
`<A HREF="mailto:boblaurie@yahoo.com">  
<IMG SRC="mail.gif" ALT="Email Me"  
BORDER="0"></A>`

## Setting Anchors

- Improves Web Page Navigation
- Anchors within a Document allow you to jump to a specific line within a document.
- Can also be used to return to a specific line from another document
- Can NOT be used in a table

## Document Anchor Syntax - 1

- Consider an anchor to be a marker that you can jump to within a document.  
`<A NAME="EDUC"></A>`
- The anchor jump is basically a hyper link directed within a document. It is signified by symbol # preceding the name.  
`<A HREF="#EDUC"> [Education] </A>`

(Brackets are optional)

## Document Anchor Syntax - 2

- Jumping to a particular line in another document can be done as shown:  
`<A HREF="Resume.html#EDUC">  
Back </A>`
- Or include a hyperlink from an image:  
`<A HREF="Resume.html#EDUC" >  
<IMG SRC="BtBack.JPG" ALT="BACK"  
BORDER="0" HEIGHT="30" WIDTH="60"  
ALIGN="BOTTOM"></A>`

## Opening Hyperlink in New Window

- Add the target attribute to the Anchor Tag and set it to `_blank`, to open a document in a new browser window you
- Examples:  
`<A HREF="Resume.html" TARGET="_blank">  
Resume</A>`  
`<A HREF="Resume.html" TARGET="_blank">  
<IMG SRC="BtBack.JPG" BORDER="0"  
HEIGHT="30" WIDTH="60"></A>`

## HTML: <Body Link Attributes>

- `BGCOLOR="#RRGGBB"` Background Color
- `TEXT="#RRGGBB"` Text Color
- `LINK="#RRGGBB"` Link Color
- `VLINK="#RRGGBB"` Visited Link
- `ALINK="#RRGGBB"` Active Link
- Recommendations:  
Make ALINK brighter than LINK brighter than VLINK  
Select TEXT and BGCOLOR for high contrast  
`<BODY BGCOLOR="#FFFFFF" LINK="#CC0000"  
VLINK="#330099" ALINK="#FF3300" TEXT="#000000"  
BACKGROUND="wpLevel.gif">`
